Competitions for Larger Groups

THEY improv: Love the Players - Love the Games

THEY improv's Audience Olympiad involves dividing the audience into 2-3 set teams. For a variety of fun Challenges, each team will select contestants to be their Champions. During the competition, each member of a group can only be chosen to be a Champion in one activity until everyone on the team has played. The team then cheers their Champions to victory, with the winner of each game getting a point for their team. The team with the most points wins prizes.

Due to the large potential size of groups, it is the one game where we do not provide the prizes. Usually we recommend swag of some type. After all, the real reward is the bragging rights from a job well done.

The games played run the full gamut with some explanations of types of games below.

In general, these shows run 60-90 minutes, but can be adjusted based on your desire. You would speak with our team to best determine the mix for your group with specific chosen games written into an addendum to the contract to get your approval subject to venue issues resulting in some changes.

Some Examples of Types of Challenges Are:

Relays: One competitor conducts an activity and then has to pass that activity to the next as the team has to accomplish the goal as a group. Everyone in the group plays their role in the overall effort and supports the work of others by taking control at a given point and doing their part successfully.

Collaboration: Teams work together to accomplish a goal such as building towers, constructing bridges, making paper airplanes, tossing them for collective distance, etc., but work as a team to prevent a break in the chain.

Skill: Individuals or pairs work together to perform some human trick such as moving cookies from their forehead to their mouth without touching it with their hands. While there is certainly an element of skill regarding this, it is mostly about fun and doing things that normally would be relatively embarrassing but receives applause and gets people to bond.

Game Shows: Often, we will include shortened versions of game shows as one of the game elements. For example, a trivia challenge or a Feud Speed Round is a common inclusion for the event. This provides a bit of familiar territory for them to play a game they are comfortable with for those less comfortable in front of others.
